

## ROUND 4

## 34-35. D. Mwaboti vs C. Odhiambo, RD4, G1

From diagram 34: 9-13! - Edinburgh - doesn't happen very often in GAYP event on high occasion.
From diagram 35: this position also is well known in 3-moves theory: 11-15* should save the game by crashing white left flank and cleaning the board, but 9-14? as played in the game, loses.

## 36. C. Odhiambo vs D. Mwaboti, RD4, G2

Another earlier loss: 26-23* is the only drawn move, and after 24-20? no way out.

## 37. S. McCosker vs I. Karny, RD4, G1

This position is drawn indeed, and after 26-22, 5-9 board was cleaned and draw agreed. However, why not try 15-10? This move in my eyes generates zero risk for white but instead - provides more winning chances after 11-15, 13-9*, 8-12 and following immediate pitch 6-9
38. R. King vs M. Nonyukela, RD4, G1

White occupied seriously center squares and the only way to stop it - play 11-15* here.

## 39. T. Hehn vs M. Sokolovsky, RD4, G1

Another clever win was missed here: 32-27*, 8-11, 19-15*, 10x19, 23x16*, 12x19, 24x8, 4x11, 21-17 and now red can't play $6-10$ or $7-10$ because of winning shot: $17-14,10 \times 17,18-14,9 \times 18,26-22$ White Wins
40. M. Sokolovsky vs T. Hehn, RD4, G2

Either 1-6 of 8-11 is OK here, but 18-22? trade loses after 23-18*.
