50. M. Sokolovsky vs A. Moiseyev, RD6, G2

Mark played here $18-22$ ? and lost after $25 \times 18,15 \times 22,24-20,11-15,28-24$ etc White Wins
Draw was still available after 3-7 (or 1-5 first), 31-26, 11-16, 26-22, 16-20, 4-8, 9-13, 8-4, 1-5, 4-8, 6-9, 8-3 (8-4, 12-16, 19x12, 14-17 Draw), 14-17* Draw

## 51-52. I. Martynov vs S. McCosker, RD6, G1

In this game I. Martynov made a losing move (diagram 51), but later S. McCosker missed a win in position on diagram 52.

Diagram 51. 2-7? as played in game, loses by 17-13*, but 2-6* is a nice draw after 30-26 (17-13, 19-24, 22-17, 14-18, 30-25, 10-15 etc Draw), 6-9*, 17-13, 10-15, 13x6, 14-18 Draw!

Diagram 52. Another good addition to missing collection: 7-11 WW, 7-10? Draw.
53. K. Layne vs R. King, RD6, G2
$1-5,1-6$ and $2-6$ is OK here, but $10-15$ ? loses by $23-18,14 \times 23,26 \times 10,7 \times 14,22-18$ as played in game.

## 54. I. Karny vs T. Hehn, RD6, G1

White played here $18-15$ ? to draw and missed a pretty win - 31-27, $16-20,32-28$ * WW

## 55. T. Hehn vs I. Karny, RD6, G2

1-5? move was played in game and lost after $13 \times 6,2 \times 9,29-25$ etc. Instead, 2-6 was correct.
56. L. Dyanibokwe vs V. Lapin, RD6, G2

Another "blunder masterpiece" - red played losing 31-27? here (10-14 is correct) and after 7-2, 1014 draw was agreed!! In fact: all white needed to do - continue 2-6/7 and red can resign.
